

#### Selihot Movie - NO PLACE ON EARTH - Saturday August 31st

In 1942, 38 men, women and children slide down a cold, muddy hole in the ground, seeking refuge from the war above in a pitch-black underground world where no human had gone before. These five Ukrainian Jewish families created their own society where young men bravely ventured into the harrowing night to collect food, supplies and chop firewood. The girls and women never left; surviving underground longer than anyone in recorded history. Held together by an iron-willed matriarch, after 511 days, the cave dwellers, ages 2 to 76, emerged at war's end in tattered clothes, blinded by a sun some children forgot existed. Despite all odds, they had survived.



The remarkable true story of NO PLACE ON EARTH starts out as a mystery. While exploring some of the longest caves in the world in southwestern Ukraine in the 1990s, American caver Chris Nicola stumbled onto unusual objects...an antique ladies shoe and comb, old buttons, an old world key. Was the vague rumor true, that some Jews had hid in this cave during WWII and if so, had any survived?

67 years later, Chris leads four of the survivors back to Ukraine to say thank you to "the cave."

#### Important High Holy Day Information

<u>Security</u> – Security personnel will be on our synagogue grounds to assist with the flow of people. Members of the Northampton Township Police Department will help to assist with traffic control on the street. Our security staff will have a visible presence at each of the entrances of the synagogue and in the parking lots. They will also assist in checking tickets as you enter the Irv and Elaine Levin Building and the Jerry and Zelda Gottesman Grand Hall entrance.

<u>Parking</u> - Kindly park your car in the synagogue parking lot, the former Davis Pontiac lot (and use the walkway from the lot to the Ohev Shalom grounds), or the parking lot of Addisville Reformed Church directly across the street from Ohev Shalom (Police will be stationed to cross pedestrians). Parking is not permitted on Township Road or in the parking lot of the public library. If your health requires that you must park on the synagogue grounds (and you possess a handicap or special permit issued by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania), please call Hilary Leboff in the synagogue office.

<u>Seating</u> – As you arrive, kindly have our volunteer ushers assist you to quickly and quietly find seats. Congregants will not be permitted to save seats.

Young Family Service - This service, primarily geared to families with children ages 2 through 7, is in Founders Hall from 9am - 10am on both days of Rosh HaShanah and on Yom Kippur.

<u>Babysitting</u> – Provided for children 2 to 4 years of age from 9am – Ipm. For everyone's safety, only children who have been pre-registered will be cared for by our babysitters. Please remember to send a kosher dairy lunch (including a drink) and diapers as necessary.

<u>Junior Congregation</u> – This service, for students entering Kindergarten through 7<sup>th</sup> grade, is held in the Rothman Family Education Building. Services begin promptly at 10:15a.m. Please pick up your children from the classrooms. Service leaders are not permitted to dismiss your children so that they may attempt to find you in the Sanctuary or in the hallways.

<u>Tallitot/Kippot</u> - All men, and women who choose to do so, are reminded to bring a Tallit and Kippah with you to services, including Kol Nidre.

<u>Lulav and Etrog Orders</u> - Orders must be placed by Monday, September 9th via email to <u>psegal@ohev.org</u> or by calling the office. Pickup is Monday, September 16th in the synagogue office.

<u>Electronic Devices</u> - To enhance the sanctity of the High Holy Days, please be certain to turn off or set to vibrate all electronic devices.

<u>Yizkor Service</u> - Entry to the Sanctuary for non-members will only be through the Jerry and Zelda Gottesman Grand Hall doors. You are invited to remain for the Yizkor service as we recite Yizkor for departed relatives as well as for our six million martyrs. For those whose custom it is to leave the service when Yizkor begins, exiting will be through the old lobby.

#### MEMBER HIGH HOLY DAY TICKET POLICY

- Tickets will be issued to congregant families in good financial standing, i.e. all June, July and August payments to Ohev Shalom received as of August I, and account is current as of August I, 2013.
- A family unit consists of husband and/or wife and their dependent, unmarried children. Tickets are not transferable.
- If your child is a full time student, regardless of age or marital status, or is single and age 30 years or younger, he or she may attend High Holy Day services as part of his/her parents' family unit with no additional fees.
- Children of congregants in good standing, who are not full time students, may attend services if:
  - A \$36 minimum contribution per person per holiday is paid by the **married children** who, with their spouse, have a combined age of 60 years or less;
  - A \$36 minimum contribution per person per holiday is paid by the **single children who, with their significant other**, have a combined age of 60 years or less.
  - The High Holy Day Guest Ticket Policy applies to an unmarried child over 30 years of age or a married child, whose combined age with his/her spouse exceeds 60 years of age.
- Any requests for children to attend High Holy Day services must be submitted in writing to the office by August 1, 2013.
- Tickets must be carried at all times. Congregants will be asked to present their tickets upon entering and leaving the Sanctuary. No one will be admitted to any service without presenting a ticket.
- We will make every effort to accommodate RESERVED seating requests for guests. However, RESERVED seating is on a first come-first served basis. If a seat adjacent to your seat has been reserved previously, your guest will be seated in the reserved seating section as close to your seat as possible.

# The reserved seats are for the first and second days of Rosh Hashanah, Kol Nidre, and Yom Kippur services. The reserved seats will be located in three different sections and will once again be in comfortable, soft upholstered chapel chairs.

While reserved seating is optional, it is an excellent opportunity to provide financial support for the synagogue and to have the convenience of knowing exactly where your family will be sitting. To reserve your seats, please complete the form below and return to Ohev Shalom along with your check.

The reserved seats will be assigned on a first-come, first-served basis. Reserved seat locations will be mailed to members in good standing in September.

### HIGH HOLY DAY GUEST TICKETS DEADLINE - FRIDAY AUGUST 9, 2013

- Guest tickets for extended family (limited to parents, children or siblings) are available to
  unaffiliated relatives living outside a 30-mile radius of Ohev Shalom. Guest tickets will be limited to
  2 per Ohev Shalom family. Guest tickets are \$150 per person for either Rosh Hashanah OR
  Kol Nidre/Yom Kippur; and \$300 per person for both holidays.
- For unaffiliated relatives, Guest ticket reservations with payment must be arranged in advance. All guest ticket requests are to be received by the synagogue office no later than Friday, August 9, 2013 and they will be mailed separately to the host congregant.
- A member of an out-of-town synagogue may worship with us as a guest, provided arrangements
  have been made in advance with our synagogue office. Out-of-town synagogue guests need to
  provide proof of membership from their "home-base synagogue" so an Ohev Shalom guest ticket
  may be issued.
- All full-time students, regardless of age or marital status, who are children or children-in-law of a
  congregant in good standing, are invited to attend High Holy Day services as part of their parents'
  family unit with no additional fee. The office must be notified by Friday, August 9, 2013.

#### Jr. Congregation and Young Teen Programming

All Religious School and Young Teen programming will take place between 10:15am and 1:00 p.m.

- Grades K through I will be located in room 204.
- Grade 2 will be located in the Youth Lounge.
- Grade 3 room 206, Grade 4 room 208, Grade 5 room 207, and Grade 6 room 203.

Each grade will meet in classrooms from 10:15am to 10:45am before mixing with other grades and going through a rotation of stations where they will do fun activities relating to Israel, Torah, Jewish Holidays, and Prayer. The children will have a brief High Holy Day service in the Prayer station. At 12:45pm, each grade will return to its designated classroom where parents can pick them up. Parents and children should check the signs in the Rothman Family Education Building for their classrooms.

• Grade 7 and Young Teens will meet in the Adath Tikvah-Montefiore Chapel for services and activities. Young teens in higher grades may choose to participate as well.

Snacks of juice, water, carrots, Fruit Roll Ups and Oreos will be provided to all grades on Rosh Hashanah and to Grades K through 2 only on Yom Kippur. Children with special dietary needs may choose to bring their own kosher dairy or parve snacks.

Religious School students who attend either sanctuary services or Religious School and Young Teen programming will receive service slips for their attendance on all days they are at Ohev Shalom.
