SPECIAL SHABBAT GATHERINGS

We have several specially named Shabbat services throughout the year. For example, on the first Friday evening of spring, we, once again, celebrated Daffodils Day Shabbat. This is an annual special Shabbat attended by the many cancer survivors in the Congregation. Though not on a Shabbat, we recently observed Yom HaShoah. Many of those in attendance are children and grandchildren and now great grandchildren of Holocaust survivors and those who have family who perished at that time. In November, we observed a Veterans Day Shabbat with special Aliyot for those who served our country in uniform and a special Shabbat luncheon in their honor. Though not annually, we have had special Shabbat services dedicated to Interfaith families in our community.

You see what all these services have in common is that while everyone is welcome to come to any and all of these services, each one involves a special subset of our Ohev Shalom community. I am interested in hearing from you if you feel that another group could benefit from a specially dedicated Shabbat. I should say many ideas may come to mind, but I imagine only a few to a handful might actually fit this category.

While Daffodils Day Shabbat involves a medical issue, I don't think that survivors of cataract surgery need have a special Shabbat. Again, we want to be sure that a dedicated Shabbat involves a critical mass of the congregation. While those whose birthday is February 29 are a most special group, how many of them can there be?

If you have an idea for a special focus of a Shabbat service, please send me a note at ravenp9215@aol.com. I don't know how many responses we'll receive. We may not be able to place each idea on the calendar for the coming year. Some might lend themselves to a Friday evening and others to a Shabbat morning. We may have done some themes and found that they had run their course, but it might just be time to place it back on our calendar.

So once again, if you have any idea(s), please send them my way. Our annual June calendar meeting is coming up soon and we will be setting dates for all aspects of our synagogue calendar for 5784, 2023-24. The sooner you communicate your idea, the better.

Our Shabbat services continue throughout the summer in the Adath Tikvah Montefiore Chapel every Friday at 6:00 PM and Shabbat morning at 9:30 AM. If you are not able to be in the synagogue, these services are broadcast through our livestream. Our Sunday morning and weekday evening services are available via Zoom. You can access livestream and Zoom via our homepage at www.ohev.org.

While I'm at it, let me mention that our annual Outdoor Summer Shabbat will happen Friday evening August 11 at a different time, 7:00 PM. It is always a very special Shabbat celebration.

As this is the final Dove Tale before the summer, my best to you for a great summer season.

Dear Congregants,

The Ohev Shalom Board is recommending the attached 2023-2024 budget and is presenting it to the Congregation for approval, in accordance with the synagogue's by-laws. A significant investment of time goes into preparing the proposed budget. When you review the budget, please understand that it is a financial plan that will be used to guide and manage spending throughout the synagogue's next fiscal year.

I would like to highlight a few key points with respect to the proposed budget:

- The budget reflects a ten percent (10%) increase in congregational dues and re-establishes the security fee at the pre-pandemic rate of \$180 per member unit. I should note that Ohev Shalom has not raised dues in six years and Hebrew School tuition remains unchanged. While the Board did its best to keep these increases to the lowest amount possible, we needed to be realistic about the impact of inflation on expenses, and like everyone else, our expenses, utilities, repairs, etc. are more costly, fees associated with maintaining the security of our congregation and building are increasing, and our Ohev Shalom home is of an age where repairs and maintenance cannot be postponed.
- The dues increase reflects these needs, on the other hand, we recognize our fiscal obligations to the membership, and the increase is less than 2% a year from what dues were when they were last changed. Recognizing the potential burden on congregants, beginning this year, the Board has implemented an option to pay annual dues in installments over 12 months, rather than the 10 month installment that had existed previously. While cash flow is not a significant concern currently, it does benefit the synagogue when members are able to pay their dues as early in the year as possible.
- Annual congregational dues represent approximately 62 percent of the revenue included in the proposed budget. The remaining revenue is driven in part by the rent received from our tenant, Richboro Animal Hospital, but is largely driven by your generous contributions to the Annual Appeal and your consistent financial support throughout the year, above and beyond your annual dues commitment. I would like to acknowledge and thank you all for this support. It is key to the financial sustainability of the congregation.
- The proposed budget does not contain any material increases in expenses in any one area or new expensive initiatives. That said, after consideration of salaries, mortgage expense, and routine building operation expenses, there was little room for other building related costs. As the buildings continue to age, unscheduled capital repairs and cosmetic improvements will be an issue that will have to be monitored regularly.




Please join me in thanking our Executive Director, Barbara Glickman, our Treasurer, Al Torjman, and the entire Board for their participation in constructing the budget.

It's a typical Sunday at 8:00 AM. Ohev is quiet, but it's a "loud" quiet, almost like waiting for something. Before I know it, it's 9:00 AM and the Grand Hall and School Wing are bustling with activity. Teachers and students are in their classrooms. More students are coming in the front door smiling and saying, "Good Morning".

On Sundays we have almost 130 students, teachers, staff, and *madirichim* (teen assistants) at Hebrew School.

It's time for my morning "sivuv" (walkabout) through the classrooms. This is my favorite part of Sunday morning Hebrew School.

The Mechina (2nd grade) class is reviewing concepts they have learned in small groups by playing games and doing activities. The Bet (4th grade) class is discussing the new place in Israel that they are "visiting" that day. Dalet (6th grade) students are answering the questions "Mah Nishma" (How are you?) in Hebrew, getting ready to practice the prayer they are going to learn or discuss kashrut. One Gimmel (5th grade) class is practicing their Hebrew reading. The Aleph (3rd grade) class is in small groups practicing their Hebrew with their friends or learning something new with their teacher. The PreGan (PreK) class is sitting in a circle singing the Shema and connecting with their classmates. Gan/Kesher (Kindergarten/1st grade) has started their unit project of Havdalah sets that they will bring home soon. The other Gimmel (5th grade) class is discussing Jewish weddings and the chuppah. This is all before 9:30.

I am always thrilled to see the wonderful things that our amazing faculty is doing with our awesome students. I can't wait to see what they are going to do next.

MARNIE DRATCH -CONGREGANT OF THE MONTH MAY-JUNE 2023

Although we tend to think of Albert Einstein primarily as the world's greatest physicist, it was he who said, "It is the supreme art of the teacher to awaken joy in creative expression and knowledge." Our May/June Congregant of the Month, Marnie Dratch, has indeed succeeded in this worthy pursuit.

Marnie grew up in Plymouth Meeting and was always active in her synagogue's youth group. She also attended Camp Harlam. At Penn State Marnie met Barry Dratch, and they were married a year after she graduated. Barry continued on to Temple Law School and currently specializes in Workers Compensation Law. Marnie's degree was in Business, but she soon began teaching Sunday School and realized that teaching was indeed her true passion. Returning to graduate school, she received a Masters Degree in Education from Arcadia University and began her teaching career in the West Windsor - Plainsboro District in New Jersey. A Masters Degree in Educational Leadership soon followed. For the past 29 years, Marnie has taught reading and language arts. Now we may address her as Dr. Marnie Dratch, as she recently earned her Doctorate in Education, one of her crowning achievements. Working with fellow congregant Allen Silverberg, Marnie brought a Holocaust Education assembly to her school for many years.

Marnie and Barry joined Ohev Shalom in 1999. They were looking for a good religious school for their three children, Brian, Tyler and Michael, and a warm, welcoming community. The family has always loved to immerse itself in joyful Jewish traditions, from building their own sukkah, creating their own family Haggadah, and dancing with the Torah on Simchat Torah. All three sons were B'nai Mitzvah at Ohev as well as members of the Confirmation Class. It was Camp Ramah in the Poconos for the Dratch boys, with Marnie working there as well for several summers. USY was the next logical step for them, as members of our local chapter and the Hagesher region.

Soon after Marnie joined Ohev Shalom, she became involved in one of the Scholar-in Residence weekends. After the Gottesman Grand Hall was added to our building and the new entrance was opened, she organized the Welcoming Committee. For many years our congregants were greeted by various committee members for both Friday night and Shabbat morning services. Ohev was lucky to count Marnie as a member of the year-long He Atid committee to work on goal-setting and the process of creating a renewed vision for the synagogue and community. Marnie also served on the board as Education Chair, working closely with Barbara Glickman and Dani Shylit to rewrite the religious school curriculum. When Gratz College closed its suburban branch for Hebrew High School, Marnie and Barbara created the Tichon Program to serve our post B'nai Mitzvah students. 
