We had a very busy November and December in Hebrew School.

Mazal Tov to the Aleph Class on their Welcome Shabbat in November. It was great to hear them introduce themselves, lead us in some prayers and sing songs.

The younger students spent some time learning about Shabbat. The PreGan and Gan classes baked Challah. The Mechina class is learning about the Torah stories and made a great Noah's Ark, and recently made 7 fat cows and 7 skinny cows from Joseph's dream.

Our Bet students are working very hard improving their Hebrew decoding skills and beginning to learn prayers from Friday night. They will be starting their Israel unit where they research different cities in Israel and make posters.

The Gimmel class is working on their "All About Me" posters which includes family research: What is their Hebrew name? Who are they named after? Where is their family from? Dalet began their Kashrut unit and practiced for their class service in January.

Tichon has been very busy on Wednesday nights. The seventh graders started learning about the Holocaust with Morah Stacie, and everyone began an Israel unit with Morah Melissa. The students had great fun baking Mandel Bread with Sisterhood. Thank you, Ivy Graff and her crew, for making it happen. During Hanukkah, Tichon students ate latkes and sufganyot and did a stained glass project.

The Hebrew School had a great time celebrating Hanukkah from the beginning of the month of Kislev. For Rosh Hodesh Kislev, students took pictures in a Hanukkah frame and enjoyed getting Hanukkah gelt. Each class learned about the Hanukkah menorah and either learned or reviewed the blessings over the candles. We had two programs before Hanukkah to reinforce Hanukkah concepts and to have fun.

Before Hanukkah, PreGan, Gan, Kesher, and Mechina had a great time during their Hanukkah Program. They played dreidel and practiced their Hebrew letters; made Hanukkah symbols with Model Magic; built Hanukkah menorahs out of Lego; learned about the Hanukkah symbols while playing Bingo; and played Hanukkah Charades. We began our program with an amazing skit performed by the Mechina class. They were awesome! *Kol HaKavod* to the Mechina students and Morah Stacey.

The Aleph, Bet, Gimmel, and Dalet students enjoyed their Hanukkah program. They made stained glass windows so we could publicize the miracle of Hanukkah, played dreidel, bingo, and charades. They also had a great time building their own version of Hanukkah menorahs out of Lego.

During Hanukkah the students met with Rabbi Perlstein and Cantor Ocanto-Romo to light Hanukkah candles, sing songs, and play the annual trivia game. It was so much fun to see the students engaged and working together to answer the questions.

In January and February, we are looking forward to the Dalet class service, Mitzvah Day, Israeli Dancing with the Bet class and Ohev Youth, and the Gimmel Class service. Before we know it, we'll be preparing for Purim and Passover.

RABBI SEARCH UPDATE

The Rabbi Search Committee is pleased to report that our Senior Rabbi job posting was completed and uploaded to the Rabbinical Assembly job board in mid-October. The job posting is a highly detailed and extensive description of our history, community, congregation, and our vision for Ohev Shalom and our next rabbi. We are currently scheduling the first round of interviews with those rabbis who have applied for the position. We anticipate that in-person weekends with the congregation will take place in late winter/early spring.

In order to keep our options open, the Search Committee has also completed and uploaded a job posting for an interim rabbi.

Why are we searching for an interim rabbi?

A best practice among synagogues with long-serving rabbis is to consider an interim rabbi to give the congregation time to reassess its values and process the change of spiritual leadership. An interim rabbi allows our congregation time to adjust to having a new spiritual and congregational leader and to ensure the rabbi we ultimately select will be the best possible fit for our community.

An interim rabbi has special training in transition management and organizational change. While we continue to search for a permanent replacement for Rabbi Perlstein, we don't want to rush into such an important decision.

How long will the interim rabbi serve, and might they become the settled rabbi?

If we choose to hire an interim rabbi, that person may serve for 1-2 years but cannot become our permanent rabbi.

What are we looking for in an interim rabbi?

The interim rabbi will perform all rabbinic functions of the synagogue, including leading services, supporting life cycle events, providing pastoral care, and engaging in educational programming. Thus, the ideal interim rabbi will have experience as both congregational and interim rabbi and will work with Cantor Annelise to continue our tradition of welcoming, warm, and musical services. In addition, the interim rabbi will help the board and congregation through the transition process as we search for a permanent rabbi.

Will I be able to share my thoughts about the search process or other ideas I have with the Search Committee?



In 2024, Ohev will again join other synagogues and churches to help feed the homeless and those in need in Bucks County. As the number of Bucks families needing help has increased, Ohev has pledged to provide 45+ meals on our assigned days.

Please join our generous congregants by signing up, preparing the promised meal(s) in your home or with friends, and then dropping the meal(s) to the Gersons' home at 4 PM on the dates you selected. The meals will be picked up by AHTD - Advocates for the Homeless and Those in Need - by 4:15 and distributed that same evening to individuals at set locations in Lower Bucks County.

We have pledged to supply 45+ meals on the fifth Monday of the months which have a fifth Monday. In 2024, those dates will be January 29, July 29, September 30, and December 30. We will not be donating in April, as the date conflicts with Passover.

A donated meal packed in a storage or take-out container might be a casserole with a side of veggies; a salad with tuna and two hard boiled eggs; or a main dish, starch and vegetable. Please add disposable utensils, napkin and a drink to your donated meal(s). A granola bar, fruit, or peanut butter crackers would be a nice addition. The portions should be for an adult, as this food may be the only meal the person will have that day.

If our January 29 collection date is designated as a Code Blue day - that is, has a temperature or windchill of 26 degrees or below, the collection will be canceled, as other resources will be utilized. We will stay in close touch as the date approaches.

CONGREGANT IN THE SPOTLIGHT – MARK KOLBER JANUARY/FEBRUARY 2024

Rabbi Jonathan Sacks informs us that "Every development in information technology is HaShem knocking on the door of the Jewish People...." Picture a five year-old so interested in playing with wires that his father had to install a fake wall outlet so that the inquiring young boy could safely pursue his interest in radio and technology! That is the story of Mark Kolber, our Congregant in the Spotlight for January/February 2024, who indeed has helped us to keep in the forefront of the modern world in order for us to continue our traditional religious heritage.

Mark was born and grew up in northern New Jersey. Amateur radio was a hobby of his in high school, and he holds an Advanced Class License WB2WHC. He earned a Bachelor of Science in Electrical Engineering at the New Jersey Institute of Technology and worked as an electronics design engineer specializing in communications equipment.

The Jersey Shore was where Mark met his wife Denise. In 1984, they moved to Phoenix, Arizona, where their two lovely daughters, Rachel and Robin, were born. A Master's Degree followed for Mark via Arizona State University. In 1994, the family moved back east to Bucks County. One of the factors important to them in choosing a new home was its proximity to the kind of synagogue they both preferred; one with the more traditional services of a Conservative synagogue. They joined Ohev Shalom shortly thereafter, and both daughters celebrated their B'not Mitzvah on Ohev's bimah. At the time, Mark never imagined how much time he would be spending at Ohev. In retrospect, the decision to join Ohev was not just good – it was brilliant! He was always a believer that it is important to contribute to the local Jewish community, and not just financially. When their daughters were young, the extent of their involvement with Ohev was mostly through the religious school. Denise suggested that he volunteer with the Ohev Players' production of *The Wizard of Oz* to help with sound. After getting to know other congregants, they both became more socially involved. Mark likes to stress how volunteering to work with various groups is a great way to build community. In 2017, he was asked to take the position of Building Chairperson. He now embraces, literally, the Jewish philosophy, *Tikkun Olam*, Repairing the World.

Remember Mark's father Henry, the man who encouraged his young son's interest and passion for things electronic? He was also a hands-on, DIY kind of guy. He taught Mark a lot about mechanical things. You may have seen Mark around the building wearing an old sweatshirt with the words MAVEN UNIVERSITY. This sweatshirt originally belonged to Henry, and Mark loves to wear it while working at Ohev. In this way, he honors the man whose own father, before the Holocaust, owned a lumber mill in their small town in Poland. After surviving several concentration camps, losing his entire immediate family, and immigrating to the U.S., Henry worked as a baker and later as a construction supervisor. As a second generation Holocaust Survivor, Mark uses his tech abilities to keep alive the memory of his father and his family. He has created a YouTube library of testimonial videos that his father recorded.
